Bequest

Many of our supporters make a charitable gift by naming **Midwest Palliative & Hospice CareCenter** in their will. In this way, they will leave a lasting legacy, ensuring that their interests will be supported beyond their lifetime.

Charitable bequests also have the added benefit of reducing or eliminating estate taxes.

Midwest CareCenter can be named as a beneficiary for an outright gift of funds or as a “remainder beneficiary” in your will or trust, and the document does not need to be rewritten in order to add a bequest. You can include a bequest by adding a dated, written and witnessed amendment (called a codicil) to your existing will or a written amendment to your trust.

Bequest Wording

Here is some sample bequest wording that might be helpful:

“I give the sum of \$ _____ (or _____ % of the remainder of my estate or trust principal) as an unrestricted gift (or for a specific purpose) to Midwest Palliative & Hospice CareCenter, an Illinois corporation.”
